

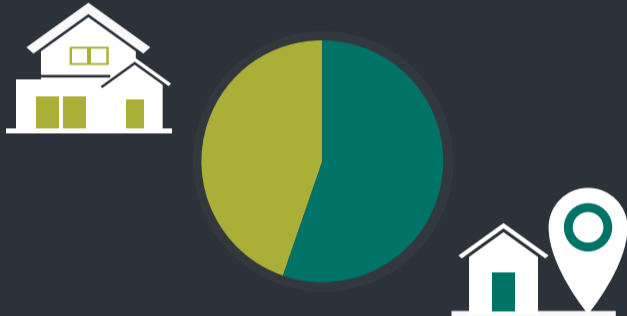

### Location over SPACE

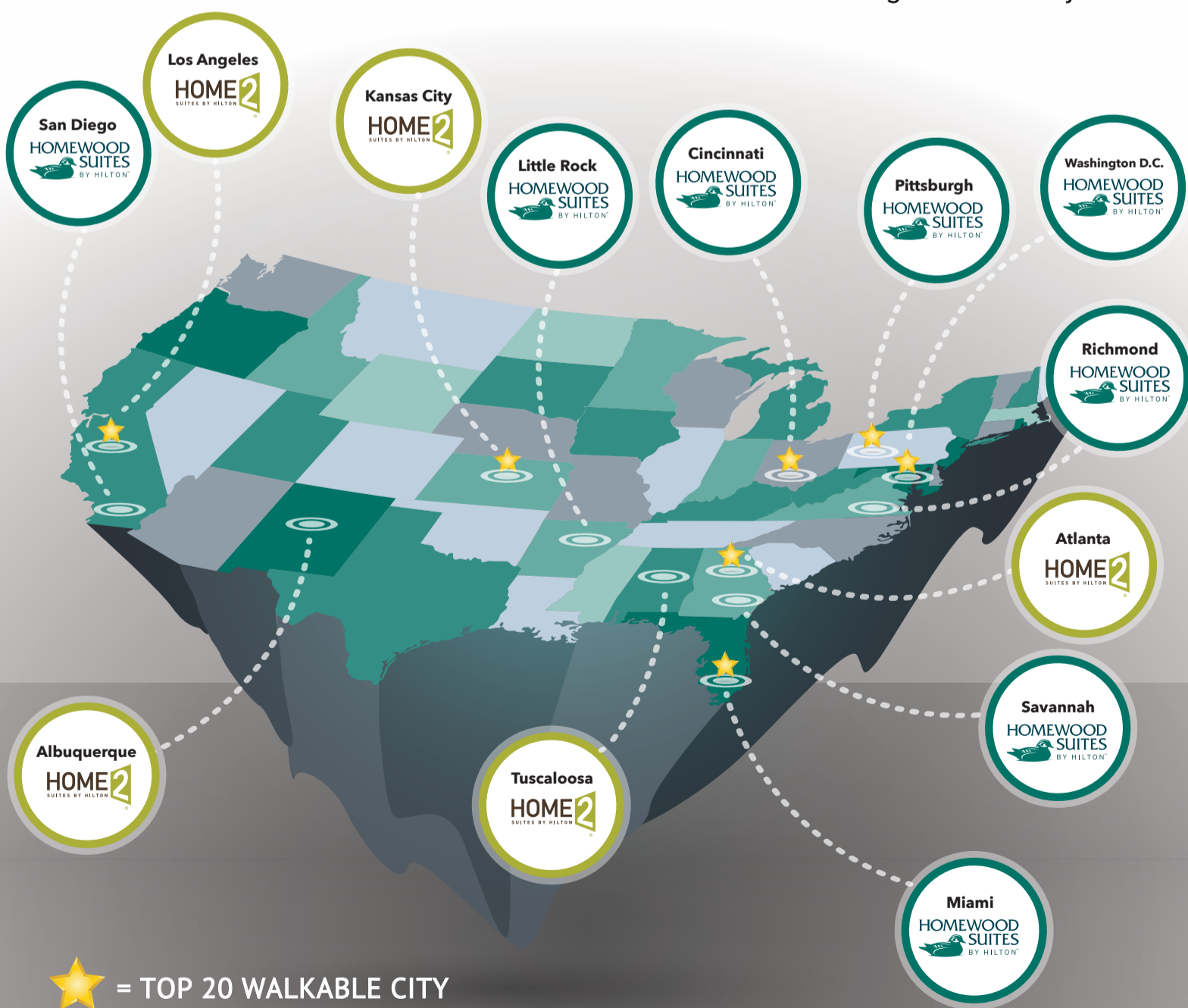
